# Plan and Prepare for your COVID-19 vaccination


COVID-19 vaccines are effective at protecting you from getting sick even after you have had COVID-19. Vaccination is an important tool to help us get back to normal. This information will help you prepare for your COVID-19 vaccination.

# How long does it take to work?



The inmune system begins to react



If someone is home bound and unable to attend one of the vaccination clinics, they should contact the Flu Hotline 1-800-534-8600 or 925-6327 or their local HSA District Health Center and arrangements will be made to with a Public Health nurse to provide the vaccine in their home.



After getting your COVID-19 vaccine, you should be monitored on site for at least 15 minutes.

### For the first Dose

You need to complete the consent form for the first Dose. You can download it here.

You need to bring your own face mask and wear it at all times while in the Vaccination center.

You will be provided with a vaccination card reflecting the date of the 1<sup>st</sup> dose. Please do not laminate your vaccination card at any time.

### For the second Dose

Bring your vaccination card reflecting your 1st dose.

You need to bring your own face mask and wear it at all times while in the Vaccination center



# **General Considerations**



Parental consent required for anyone 12 - 17 years old.



Do not bring children, when possible.



No pets are allowed at the vaccination clinic.



Persons 60 years and older will be given priority.

You should get a vaccination card that tells you what COVID-19 vaccine you received, the date you received it, and where you received it. Keep your vaccination card in case you need it for future use.

Consider taking a picture of your vaccination card as a backup copy.
